## INTRODUCTION

The Government of Kosovo is committed to ensuring and guaranteeing the rights of all communities in Kosovo, and to adhere to all international standards of human rights, as spelled out in various international conventions, in the Constitution of Kosovo and Kosovo legislation.

The Government of Kosovo considers that the conditions under which Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities live and conduct their life in Kosovo require swift, concrete and effective policies and actions in order to ensure the successful integration of the three communities and enable their contribution to Kosovo society.

*The Republic of Kosovo Action Plan on the Implementation of the Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities, 2009-2015*, initiative is part of the undergoing efforts of the Government of Kosovo to improve the life of all Kosovo communities. Such efforts will allow the establishment of the adequate political, social, and economic, educational and cultural conditions which will support these communities in creating and strengthening their identity, as well as, will enforce the recognition and protection of their individual and community values.

The establishment of a multi-ethnic and inclusive society that provides equal opportunities for development, participation and welfare of all individuals, regardless of their ethnicity, religion, gender, age, physical and mental abilities, and cultural and ideological orientation, remains a major challenge for the Government of Kosovo and Kosovo society, as well.

The Action Plan document produced by keeping in mind the existing commitments of Kosovo Government in other sectors, undertaken at national and local level, will assist the Government of Kosovo and all identified stakeholders in overcoming the aforementioned challenges and contribute to the social, economic and political development of the country, as a whole.

### The Action Plan Drafting Process

The Action Plan is a detailed articulation of the measures proposed in the *Kosovo Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities, 2009 - 2015*, approved by Government of Kosovo on December 24, 2008.

Following upon the steps of the useful and effective experience gained during the drafting of the *Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities*, the Office of Good Governance, in the Office of the Prime Minister, as the responsible and coordinating body for the drafting of the Action Plan document, has pursued a comprehensive and participatory process.

The Action Plan drafting process involved all line Ministries, executive agencies, non-governmental organisations and in particular organisations representing the Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities. Local and international organisations, working in the areas of social services and employment orientation and facilitation and protection of human rights, were also involved. International partners provided their comments and opinions at various meetings and at the public presentation of the first draft of the Action Plan document.

Prior to the initiation of the drafting process, a set of guidelines were circulated to all line ministries and executive agencies. The guidelines set up a framework for the development of the action plan that provided the involved parties with a common understanding on the desirable process, instructed them on a practical step-by-step approach to developing the document and coordinate the process and finally, introduced a suitable document format and explained its elements.

The guidelines placed a strong emphasis on institutional coordination and demanded that all involved institutions:

- set out priorities for each respective sector based on the document of the Government of Kosovo Strategy for the Integration Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities, ,
- the identification and prioritization process is characterized by close cooperation between the civil service and political staff;
- propose and rank activities' priority accordingly, to ensure swift response, credible and sustainable outcomes, and make choices that define underlying values, i. e equity versus cost-effectiveness,
- take into account, during the process: a) institutional management capacities, b) human and financial resources required for the implementation of envisaged activities, and c) consistency between proposed action plan activities and existing commitments and new strategies.

Line ministries and executive agencies submitted their input through:

- meetings held with the inter-ministerial working group for drafting the Action Plan document,



- extended recommendations during workshops held with a number of ministries, that brought together various ministerial departments in a number of ministries and fostered a dialogue between civil servants and political staff,
- submission of comments and recommendations as the work on the drafting of the Action Plan document progressed.

The Advisory Office on Good Governance and Human Rights (AOGG) circulated the first draft at a public meeting, with wide representation attendance. The debate brought together Kosovo's central public administration institutions, local non-governmental organisations, bilateral and multilateral donors and international bodies in charge of monitoring the progress and consolidation of democratic institutions and processes, in the Republic of Kosovo. In a separate event, all line ministries and non-governmental organisations representing the three communities were brought together for a second round of debate on the action plan document. The last event, also, enabled organisations that could not participate in the first round of the public debate on the draft document, to provide their comments.

## Action Plan Conceptual Framework

The Action Plan document represent a detailed process and action steps needed to be implemented within the defined timeframe that ensures the fulfilment of the measures outlined in the *Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities, 2009-2015*. In addition, the Action Plan document was prepared in compliance with the *Kosovo Medium Term Expenditure Framework 2010-2012*, the *Kosovo European Partnership Action Plan*, and sectoral and cross-sectoral strategies that are already being implemented in Kosovo. Draft documents of strategies or action plans pending Kosovo Government approval were also taken under consideration. Aiming at avoiding already recognized pitfalls and draw on both lessons learnt and success stories, during the drafting process, closed attention was paid to a vast variety of concerns and recommendations extended from various entities on the national strategy documents and activities carried out by member states of the Roma Decade. It should be noted that Kosovo is not a member state of the Roma Decade network, (a detailed list of documents taken into consideration for drafting this Action Plan, can be found in the Annex A of the document).

As noted elsewhere in the document, *The Republic of Kosovo Action Plan on the Implementation of the Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities 2009-2015*, represents a cross-sectoral initiative.

Subsequently, during the drafting process, special emphasis was given to

the establishment of links among its individual elements, as well as, other policies and initiatives undertaken by the Government of Kosovo. The approach was chosen to ensure and maintain coherence among public policy documents and also, to establish interrelation between public policy and the quality of life experienced by the Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities. Further, the pursued approach ensures that individuals and these communities do not become invisible when it comes to the distribution of and access to national resources and most importantly, the one-size-fits all answers are avoided.

Finally, an emphasis on the close link between this Action Plan and other public policy documents under implementation, aims at increasing both funds' efficiency and balanced distribution of the budget that subsequently would avoid the unnecessary duplication of funds in planning and implementation of this nation-wide initiative.

The activities proposed in the Action Plan fall into four main categories:

- *Survey, evaluation and research studies.* This set of activities aims at filling the gap of quantitative and qualitative data, at all life aspects, on Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities. Further, the data collection exercise will facilitate the need identification process will track the effective implementation of the proposed changes. Finally, the data collection will enable a comprehensive and inclusive monitoring and evaluation process of the overall action plan activities.
- *Improvement of the socio-economic and representative status of the three communities.* Recognizing that Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities experience deeply-rooted social exclusion, manifested through lack of access to opportunities, resources and services, as well as lack of voice and power to change their situation, the identified action steps in this category aim at:
  - providing excluded groups access to assets, capabilities and opportunities so they can improve their livelihood and lay foundation for upward mobility,
  - providing space and opportunities, so that excluded groups develop voice, confidence and capabilities to engage on equal footing with those groups who are socio-economically better off and also, can influence institutions which decisions affect them,
  - removing formal and informal institutional barriers that foster exclusion or maintain the status quo, in both policy and system levels, enabling all society groups equal access to

development opportunities without discrimination in any form.

- *Information sharing and awareness raising.* Three groups beneficiaries will be targeted through this set of activities:
  - *Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities* will be informed about their rights and responsibilities, about the roles of state run institutions, services that are currently being provided and ought to be provided. Also, it will offer awareness raising activities on matters of representation, participation and anti-discrimination. The deep-rooted social norms, values and beliefs will be addressed as well, as they are recognised as barriers to social change and a major obstacle to implement the action plan smoothly.
  - The second targeted group is the *Kosovo public* at wide. The overall goal of the awareness-raising campaigns and public activities remains to increase tolerance and acceptance of cultural and ethnic differences as a national treasure and as an opportunity for cooperation.
  - Finally, *civil servant staff* will participate in awareness-raising session and will attend capacity building events focusing specifically on needs and characteristics of all three communities. The staff's positive attitude and their responsiveness to the conditions of the target groups are important for accelerating the social inclusion process.
- *Identity construction of the three communities.* This will be accomplished through: *establishing identity as a physical existence* where special emphasis will be placed on civil registration from birth; *educational identity*; *representative and participatory identity* – as a member of public administration, as a political representative, as a representative of law and order, as an active contributor to social and economic development of the society; *cultural identity* – as a creator and active participant in the rich ethnic and cultural mosaic of Kosovo.

The format of the *Action Plan on the Implementation of the Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities, 2009 -2015*, includes technical elements of public policy implementation process. The pursued Action Plan format aims also at eliminating the problems with which member states of the Roma Decade were confronted, to name few, the lack of budget allocation, institutional responsibilities, detailed activities/action steps and corresponding relationships among the elements of the action plan. The

document includes sectoral goal and objectives, detailed activities and action-steps, defined responsible and supporting institutions, means of verification, and cost-estimation for each activity.

Special consideration was given to the identification and the design of the Action Plan indicators, which represent a combination of both qualitative and quantitative ones, with characteristics that allow for structural, outcome and process measurement.

The Action Plan contains nine sector, namely, *education, employment and economic empowerment, health and social affairs, housing and informal settlements, returns and reintegration, registration, culture, media and information, participation and representation, and security, policing and justice*. Gender and anti-discrimination, as crosscutting themes, are anchored in all abovementioned sectors.

## **Institutional Arrangements for the Implementation of the Action Plan**

Institutional overseeing and coordination of *the Republic of Kosovo Action Plan on the Implementation of the Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities 2009-2015*, will take place at three levels. Daily implementation will be performed by line ministries, executive agencies and municipalities, in cooperation with local and international partners.

A technical working group will be established and function as the Action Plan Technical Working Group for the Implementation of the Strategy for the Integration of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian Communities (APTWG). The APTWG will keep track of the implementation of the Action Plan, will examine issues at the policy level and undertake continuous and close monitoring steps. Also, the APTWG will harmonize and coordinate Government and donor investments and will advice on funding priority matters.

The Technical Working Group will cover four key areas aiming at the effective implementation of the Action Plan activities and the accomplishment of the objectives envisaged in it:

### **1. Coordination**

Coordination is one of the main functions of the APTWG due to the cross-sectoral nature of the Action Plan. The APTWG will coordinate the work among line Ministries and executive agencies. It will also coordinate the work among state institutions and donors with special emphasis at the technical level in order

to prevent duplication of programs/projects. Simultaneously, it will ensure that the financial resources will be enhanced and decision-making process will improve significantly, during the Action Plan implementation.

Finally, the APTWG will establish and coordinate among line Ministries, donors, non-governmental organisations and the Steering Committee through: submission of periodical reports, communication on issues requiring political decisions without delay, dealing with problems requiring fast solutions, as well as communicating necessary changes to the approved Action Plan.

## **2. Information Sharing Among Ministries, Donors and Non-Governmental Organisations**

The APTWG will serve as an information sharing platform among ministries and executive agencies, donors and non-governmental organisations.

Also, the APTWG will act as an information collecting and distributing centre. The information will be shared through regular meetings, by organizing thematic meetings, presentation of projects and programs undertaken by various stakeholders. In addition, it will collect and share information on the progress achieved from the Roma Decade members countries. The type of information will focus on three key areas: research studies, best practices and lessons learnt from their experience, and networking opportunities.

## **3. Monitoring and Evaluation**

The APTWG will monitor and assess progress against goals, objectives and indicators outlined in the Action Plan document. It will also collect and analyze the data delivered by the line Ministries and projects implemented by donors. The progress reports will be published on quarterly basis. The technical group will also draft six-month progress reports and the annual report, which will be presented to and approved by the Steering Committee. Reports will be published on the electronic webpage of the Office of the Prime Minister.

The APTWG will approve terms of references for periodic sectoral evaluation, as well as, it will draft terms of references for formative and summative evaluation of the Action Plan, that will be approved by the Steering Committee.

## **4. Formulation and Prioritization of Policies**

The APTWG will assist in the formulation of short-term and long-term policies and will draft recommendations on coordination of sectoral planning. It

will also be involved in activities prioritization through discussion of public policy agenda, by engaging in the process the Steering Committee and other working groups involved in the drafting of such documents such as the Medium-Term Expenditure Framework, sector and cross-sector strategies, etc. In the activities prioritization process, the APTWG will ensure full participation and take into consideration the contribution of civil society actors.

The APTWG will not duplicate the responsibilities of line Ministries and these institutions will continue to perform their main role in planning and prioritizing, and monitoring the implementation of their respective sectoral activities.

The APTWG will meet not less than four times per year. Members of the APTWG may organize additional meetings if required. Taking into account the cross-sectoral nature of the Action Plan and its priorities and to effectively fulfil its role, the APTWG will draft its annual working plan and it will submit it for approval to the Steering Committee. The Office of Good Governance will provide logistic and administrative support for the APTWG work.

The APTWG will be composed of eleven members. The Head of the Office on Good Governance will chair the APTWG. The permanent members of the APTWG are: Office of Communities' Affairs, Ministry of Returns and Communities, Agency for Coordination of Development and European Integration, Gender Equality Agency, Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare and Ministry of Health. Three other members will be chosen from the donor community and the other two members will be selected from line Ministries, in compliance with the needs and the weight of the potential investments in respective sectors of the Action Plan.

The Inter-Institutional Steering Committee for the Implementation of Action Plan is a political body with a wide institutional representation. The Committee will be comprised of eleven members and will be chaired by the Deputy Prime Minister. Members of the Committee will be: the Minister of Education, the Minister of the Environment and Spatial Planning, the Minister of Health, Director of the Office of Good Governance, who acts also as the Deputy Head of the Committee, Director of the Office on Community Affairs, one member from the Communities' Consultative Council (to be appointed by the Council), the Ombudsperson, and one representative of Roma, Ashkali and Egyptian communities.

The Steering Committee will:

- ensure coordination between the public and non-governmental sector,

- enable dialogue on harmonization of public policy activities of the state institutions with the needs of communities, communicated through the representatives of non-governmental organisations,
- approve the proposed changes and necessary interventions to the Action Plan document,
- ensure that the proposed changes support the realisation of sector objectives and the accomplishment of goals as outlined in the Action Plan,
- present the approved changes of the Steering Committee before the Meeting of the Council of Ministers of Kosovo,
- ensure that public policy documents such as programs, strategies and action plans approved by the Government of Kosovo take into account and are coordinated with the Action Plan activities,
- ensure that during the review and the approval of the Medium Term Expenditure Framework, the Action Plan identified activities are financially covered by the Kosovo Consolidated Budget,
- approve the annual progress report on the implementation of the Action Plan,
- approve terms of references on periodical sector assessments and formative and summative evaluation of the implementation of the Action Plan,
- undertake activities such as: field visits, project sites visits, organization of national and international events and other activities that provide hands-on familiarization opportunities or advocate and lobby for additional resources or establish networking prospects.

The Committee and its functions will be officialized by a Council of Ministers' decree, once the Action Plan is approved. In accordance with priorities defined by the Government of Kosovo, Ministers and members of this Committee will be replaced or will continue to perform the envisaged duties.

### **Informing the Public**

The Government of Kosovo, in the context of its efforts to increase transparency and accountability before beneficiaries, Kosovo public at large and international partners, considers as crucial the information of the public on the progress achieved as the Action Plan implementation gets under way

Therefore, the Government will establish a portal on the electronic webpage of the Office of the Prime Minister that will contain the Action Plan and the Strategy documents, progress reports and Government decrees related to the implementation of the Action Plan. Adequate space on the website will be given to information on projects and programs undertaken by the Government, donors

and non-governmental organisations that contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the Action Plan. Periodical evaluation reports, studies and research documents, calendar of national and international events will be posted on the webpage, as well.
